





WISH TK-12 Fall Opening- Safety

- TK-12 Full Day instruction; regular schedule for all schools
- Entrance screening
- Weekly COVID-19 testing
- All wear masks indoors and outdoors
- Additional cleaning and sanitization
- Eating outside, distancing with yoga mats and spacing at the tables, and and grade level groups
- Hand-washing and sanitizer
- Ventilation- doors open, A/C on, fans added
- New filters in all classrooms
- Assigned seating (seating charts)
- Maximal distancing in classrooms





All spaces on campus open and available

- Pupils will switch classes; go to elective teachers
- PE is outdoors and students will wear masks

WISH TK-12 Fall Independent Study

- Students on Long Term Independent Study (more than 10 days)
 - a. Weekly scheduled meeting with WISH Independent Study Coordinator
 - b. Access to WISH faculty office hours through Zoom
 - c. Daily synchronous morning meeting/advisory
 - d. May participate on WISH sports teams or in afterschool activities and special on-campus events (must follow onsite requirements for testing, masking, etc.)
 - e. Full suite of online educational tools and curriculum to support growth and achievement
- Students on Short Term Independent Study (3 to 10 days)
 - a. Same as a-c above
 - b. Same as d above, unless quarantining due to COVID requirements
 - c. Curriculum requirements aligned to onsite classroom coursework



Will we go to Distance or Hybrid learning?

- CDE, CDPH, and LACDPH don't anticipate rates rising to the level of a needed school closure
- All WISH positive COVID cases are reported to the health department
- If several cases occur in a single grade level or within a school and we are directed to close a whole class, the entire grade level, or the entire school down by the LACDPH we will provide synchronous and asynchronous instruction using the **same Distance Learning model** and schedule that was used last year
- For positive cases and close contacts who are required to quarantine we will follow the exposure management guidelines published by LAUSD (Rev. 8/23/21) and move those pupils to short term Independent Study for the duration of their quarantine





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COVID 19 Preparation and Mitigation Plans

Mitigation Strategies from CDPH:

- 1. Get vaccinated
- 2. Maintain consistent and correct mask use for adults and pupils
- 3. Maximize physical distancing
 - a. Spread kids out in your classrooms
 - b. Use a seating chart for students seated at desks, while completing group work, and on carpets
 - c. Students are to be distanced outdoors for eating, with their stable grade level cohorts, use yoga mats as needed
 - d. Students should have their own materials whenever possible; disinfect shared materials
- 4. Participate in Weekly Testing



ISH COVID 19 Preparation and Mitigation Plans

Mitigation Strategies from CDPH Continued:

- 5. Ventilation
 - a. Both classroom doors are to remain open
 - b. A/C is to be working and on at all times
 - i. A formal fix it ticket is generated on the same day for any faulty HVAC units
 - ii. Use the 4 large fans in each corner of the room and a fan for the teacher's desk
 - iii. Additional fans are available for each classroom to circulate air
- 6. Follow Hand-washing and respiratory etiquette
- 7. Stay home when sick and get tested before returning
- 8. Participate in contact tracing, quarantine, and isolation
- 9. Cleaning and Disinfection

Print and provide <u>LA County Department of Public Health isolation instructions</u> to parent when student is picked up.

Staff Case Management

Direct the employee to go home immediately and provide via print out or email the <u>LA County Department of Public Health isolation instructions</u> to employee.



Contact Tracing (LAUSD Containment Plan Updated 8/23/21)

For all cases:

- □ Identify close contacts for COVID Exposure (CE) Team
 - □ Within 6 feet for 15 minutes or greater over 24 hour period
 - CE Team works with student, faculty, and parent to identify close contacts indoors and outdoors
- □ Identify immediate areas on site to be closed off and disinfected.
- If the close contacts are staff members on campus, provide LA County Department of Public Health quarantine instructions via print out or email, instruct the staff members to notify their supervisor(s), and send them home to quarantine immediately until the CE Team can follow up with them.

If a positive COVID-19 case is known after hours, or prior to the start of the school day, the school may contact exposed staff, students or parents to ask them not to report to the school or site the CE Team can investigate the case.



Exposure Management

Notifications:

- If minor, notify parent/guardian; if adult notify and send home
- Close contacts (6 ft; greater than 15 minutes, within 24 hour period) are notified by phone and email
- Los Angeles County Department of Public Health notification form
- LAUSD COVID Response Team
- Schoolwide communication is sent by email to families and staff

*Positive case and close contacts must quarantine as directed; Coursework may be accessed during the short term quarantine through independent study

Arrivals via Car

- Complete a SchoolPass wellness check at home before you get to the valet line
- At valet line, show completed Green Wellness Pass from the SchoolPass app to WISH staff and staff verifies negative COVID test on file









Arrivals via Wheels or Walk

- Each child completes a SchoolPass wellness check at home with parent/guardian
- At walk-up station, child shows Wellness Pass from the SchoolPass app to WISH staff or provides name and WISH staff views completed Wellness Pass on app dashboard and verifies negative COVID test is on file







Departures

Valet Pick Up

- Parents enter valet line, WISH staff enters child's name into SchoolPass app (ES Only); MS and HS are released
- Teachers receive updates, students sent to car

Walking Pick Up with parent/guardian

- Parents stand at walk-up station, WISH staff enters child's name into app (ES Only); MS and HS are released
- Teachers receive updates, students sent to walk-up station

Drivers/Bikers/Walkers/Athletes/Extended Day - Anything different than valet

• Parents/guardians provide approval in SchoolPass app; teachers will see on SchoolPass dashboard what students have different departure permissions



CoVerify Weekly COVID-19 Testing

Step 1: Complete the New CoVerify testing Registration form

- <u>COVID REGISTRATION LINK- ALL Families Must Complete</u>
- Your negative COVID test is good for the access to campus for the following week
- If your test results are not received within 48 hours you can complete the form below or contact the office manager for your school
- Office managers will notify faculty, staff, and students of rejected test results and how to retest
- The principal or administrative designee will notify family of positive test results as soon as they are available and then exposure management rules will be followed
- If you are exposed and identified as a close contact your family may be asked to acquired a second COVID test within the same week to return to campus

Phase Update

Currently, we are in the beginning stages of phases 1-3, providing 1:1 services and small learning hubs on campus while continuing online distance learning. We are making plans to provide some social-emotional learning opportunities on campus in phase 4 and looking forward to a phase 5 return to campus, while again continuing to offer online distance learning. Phase 5 (Hybrid) of our Return to Campus plan is projected to begin on Monday, April 19, 2021.
