

## Drop-Off / Pick-Up



WISH is excited to have students on campus. We love seeing families too during drop-off and pick-up. To ensure safety for everyone and to be as respectful to our neighbors as possible, please observe the following guidelines

-Please use only crosswalks to and from your vehicle. NO JAYWALKING!

-Please observe all traffic rules, signals and please drive carefully, especially in the school-zones. NO U-TURNS in and out of the valet line and do not block any crosswalks.

-Please have SchoolPass ready as you approach valet and the gate or drop-off/pick-up area.

-Please do not crowd the gate areas and observe all school signage and guidelines for an efficient and safe process for everyone.

## LCAP / ESSER Funds



School districts, county offices of education, or charter schools, collectively known as LEAs, that receive Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funds under the American Rescue Plan Act, referred to as ESSER III funds, are required to develop a plan for how they will use their funds. In the plan, an LEA must explain how it intends to use its ESSER III funds to address students' academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs, as well as any opportunity gaps that existed before, and were worsened by, the COVID-19 pandemic. An LEA may also use its ESSER III funds in other ways, as detailed in the Fiscal Requirements section of the Instructions. In developing the plan, the LEA has flexibility to include community input and/or actions included in other planning documents, such as the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP), provided that the input and actions are relevant to the LEA's Plan to support students.
